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Description of the parameter sets

The table provides the value of the major parameters involved in the parameter sets (column 1) used in this study. Parameters λ_2 and λ_4 (columns 2 and 3) are applied in the Rayleigh damping term of the equation of the quasi-geostrophic potential vorticity. The coefficients amplw and explw (columns 4 and 5) are used in the longwave radiative scheme to compute anomaly in humidity. The uncertainties in the albedo of the ocean and sea ice are accounted for through albocef (column 6) and albice (column 7). The minimum vertical diffusion coefficient in the ocean is scaled according to avkb (column 8). CorA is a correction factor for the distribution of precipitation over the ocean (column 9). More details about these parameters are available in Goosse et al. (2007) and Loutre et al (2011).
